Eligible supporting documentation must be:

- Written by someone in a position of authority (not yourself or a family member/friend) who is qualified to comment on your circumstances* i.e.
 - doctor
 - psychologist
 - social worker
 - lawyer
 - accountant
 - health care provider
 - police or law enforcement member;
- Specific about the circumstances and their impact on your ability to meet the eligibility requirements of the Hansen Scholarship**
- Dated within the last 3 months; and
- Either on official letterhead or containing an original signature (PDF preferred)

*If your circumstances are medical, you must submit a letter from a doctor or qualified health care provider.

**For example:

- Your doctor may write a letter stating that your medical condition will not allow you to study full-time for the next 6 months, or that you need to live in different accommodation, or take a break from the enrichment program
- if you were a victim of a crime and this impacted your WAM, a social worker, lawyer, police/law enforcement member, psychologist, doctor etc. could state that your academic results were impacted by what happened

If you did not meet the requirements and there were no extraneous factors (e.g. maybe you worked too much, did not anticipate the workload of your subjects, were not as organised as you could be) you may not have a letter from someone external to the University. In this case, please ensure your answers to the above questions take responsibility for what happened and what you will do differently going forward. If you have met with an academic advisor, you could include a study plan or letter from them as your documentation.
